

**RESOLUTION #08 -0818-02**

**A Resolution authorizing a fire engine to be sold by public auction or by sealed bid**

**Whereas**, Liberty Township Fire Department periodically replaces certain fire engines and upgrades certain equipment and has requests the Board of Trustees declare the 1988 Sutphen fire engine as no longer needed for public use and to authorize staff to sell and convey in accordance with ORC 505 (A)(1), and

**Whereas**, the Fire Chief is requesting that the used 1988 Sutphen fire engine be declared surplus or "no longer needed for public use" and that it has value of greater than \$2500,

**Now, Therefore Be it Resolved, by the Liberty Township Board of Trustees, Delaware County** that the used Fire Engine 321, a 1988 Sutphen, is hereby declared obsolete or no longer needed for public use and has a value of greater than \$2500 under ORC 505.10(A)(1) section (1) and that the Township Administrator is authorized to sell it by public auction or sealed bid to the highest bidder and to remove said property from the Township property inventory and insurance schedules upon completion of the sale.

This Resolution shall be in force and become effective immediately upon its execution.

## Fire Engine sale

(1) If the fair market value of property to be sold is, in the opinion of the board, in excess of two thousand five hundred dollars, the sale shall be by public auction or by sealed bid to the highest bidder. The board shall publish notice of the time, place, and manner of the sale once a week for three weeks in a newspaper published, or of general circulation, in the township, the last of those publications to be at least five days before the date of sale, and shall post a typewritten or printed notice of the time, place, and manner of the sale in the office of the board for at least ten days prior to the sale.

If the board conducts the sale of the property by sealed bid, the form of the bid shall be as prescribed by the board, and each bid shall contain the name of the person submitting it. Bids received shall be opened and tabulated at the time stated in the published and posted notices. The property shall be sold to the highest bidder, except that the board may reject all bids and hold another sale, by public auction or sealed bid, in the manner prescribed by this section.
