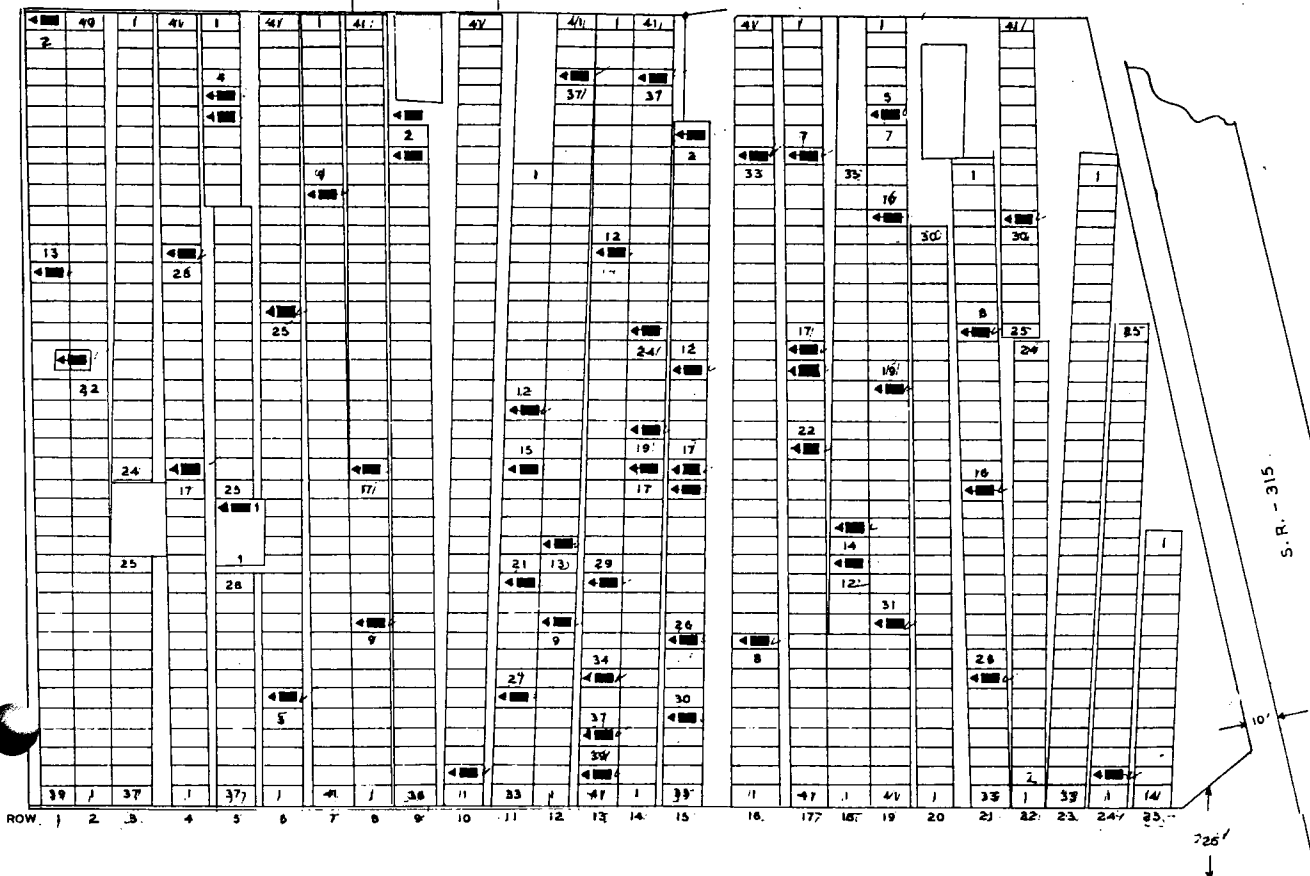

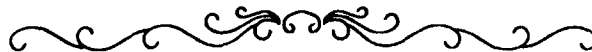

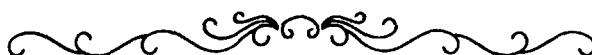

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Liberty Cemetery Inventory

Read Oct. 10, 1947—Source 4

Read August 22–30, 1995 by Judith K. Brozek & Jeffrey D. Hamilton

When reading this cemetery in 1995, we listed the graves according to the rows and numbering depicted on the WPA map from the late 1930's. In some cases, the WPA row and grave numbers given for known veterans did not match today's location of markers. When this occurred, we listed the markers as they are positioned today, sometimes noting their prior position.

Based on the WPA veterans list, and the 1947 and 1995 readings, there are 507–511 known burials in Liberty Cemetery. Because the records for this cemetery have been lost, there is no way to determine whether or not all of the 917 gravesites and four family lots shown on the WPA map are occupied. It can only be assumed that the many areas without tombstones are occupied. It seems that this cemetery should be more than 56% full based on its central location in the community and its relationship to Liberty Church.

The cemetery is the most visible in Liberty Township; however, there are many broken or toppled stones as well as many about to fall in 1995. Grass has grown over many of the stones that have fallen. Most of these stones are still legible. In general, the stones are in need of maintenance. In some places, bushes and poison ivy are growing around the tombstones. The grass is cut and fence maintained by the Liberty Trustees.

NOTE: Local legend states that John Flanigan Cellar went off to the War of 1812 and upon his return found his girlfriend Lydia Sackett on her deathbed. Upon her death, John received permission from her father to bury her in a grove of oak trees on the land he would one day inherit. If Lydia died in 1814 as reported, her burial was not the first in this location: Capt. Joab Norton was interred here in 1813.* (Further reserach must be done to verify the date of Lydia Sackett's death.)

In 1816, John's father Thomas was buried in this same grove of tall oaks, marking the beginning of a family burying ground. The next known burial was another relative (Nancy Flanagan) in 1820, the same year John and his brother George received a contract of \$70 to build Liberty Presbyterian Church. Thirty-five years later, John deeded to the trustees of Liberty Church the three acres upon which the church, cemetery and school house stood.

Liberty Cemetery, sometimes called "Old Liberty," is the most visible of the township's pioneer burying grounds because of its location on the corner of S. R. 315 and Home Road. It is the largest in the Olentangy River Valley, its size attributable to its association with Liberty Church. Liberty Cemetery is the final resting place of more veterans of war than any other cemetery in the township.

*Although the 1880 History of Delaware County states that Capt. Joab Norton (one of the organizers of a local rifle company that fought in the War of 1812) "...was buried with Masonic honors in the first cemetery laid out in the city (Delaware)," Capt. Norton's tombstone is in Liberty Cemetery. His wife Lucy is buried beside him. When Norton arrived in 1807, his land was in Liberty Township; but in 1816, three years after his death, that portion of Liberty was set off in creating Orange Township. According to the 1880 History of Delaware County, the company of riflemen Norton led was "...composed (in 1809) mostly of Liberty men, and consisted of some forty officers and privates." It is probable that John Flanigan Cellar was in this company that was ordered to defend the boundary line at Norton, between Delaware and Marion commencing June, 1812. Later, the company built a blockhouse at Sandusky. When Norton was not given command of this blockhouse, he and his company were retired in August of 1812.
